Lent 2024 - Taking our penances to the next level



This Lent, walk with Our Lady on the road to Calvary, and accompany her in her grief.

The beautiful woman watched with incomprehensible pain as her Son's flesh was torn, His hands pierced, and His Body offered as a living sacrifice. The Man upon the cross was once the young boy she nurtured and raised, His wounded Body the same one that grew within her womb, and His anguished Face that of her beloved only Son.

On the road to Calvary, she is Our Lady of Sorrows, bearing an unbearable pain. This Lent, we are called to mourn with her. Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows is heightened during the Season of Lent. Another way to honour Our Lady of Sorrows is by praying the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary, traditionally prayed on Tuesdays, Fridays, and Sundays during Lent.

MARCH: THE MONTH OF ST JOSEPH

St Joseph, the Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Guardian of Jesus Christ:



What better patron can the Church have? In fact on 8th December, 1870, Blessed Pope Pius IX declared St Joseph to be the **Patron or Protector of the Universal Church**. So we take him as our protector.



First Collection? Or Second Collection? Each collection is important.

The First Collection is partly used for Father's living expenses and the surplus is sent to the Archdiocese, mainly to help poor parishes that are in need of financial support.

The Second Collection stays at the Parish and is used towards paying all the expenses of the church, such as insurance, electricity, water, repairs & maintenance, printing costs, wages and superannuation.

We are blessed to have a frugal Parish Priest and generous parishioners, however, our Finance Committee has noticed a trend of decreasing funds in the **Second Collection**.

Thankfully, our Parish is in a sound financial position, however, if the trend continues for too long, the Parish will eventually come to a point where we are unable to meet our costs. It is important that today's parishioners support the Parish to cover its day-to-day running costs to ensure it remains financially viable to support the parishioners of the future.

If you can afford a couple of extra dollars each week, could we suggest that you support the **Second Collection** each Sunday.
